ICYMI: Bureau of Elections Denies Democrats' Challenge to Tudor Dixon's Petitions

"...staff recommends rejecting the challenge..."

GRAND HAVEN, MI -- The Bureau of Elections denied the Democrats' attempt to remove Tudor Dixon from the ballot Monday.

In a story titled, "**James Craig, Perry Johnson, three others shouldn't make GOP ballot, state says**," Bridge [reported](#):

Tudor Dixon, who scored the backing of the powerful family of former U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos earlier Monday, survived a Democratic challenge to her candidacy and should qualify for the Aug. 2 primary despite an error in her petition header, according to a [Bureau of Elections report](#).

Democrats feigned confusion over the date the governor's term ends as a flailing, desperate attempt to remove Dixon from the ballot.

"...the defect in the Dixon nominating petitions is similarly harmless and staff recommends rejection of the challenge," the Bureau [wrote](#) in its recommendation to the Board of Canvassers.

"Because the challenges which staff recommends accepting and the signatures submitted by fraudulent-petition circulators do not place a sufficient number of signatures into question to bring Ms. Dixon below the threshold of required signatures, staff recommends rejecting the challenge and determining the petition sufficient."
